TOP PLACES IN AZERBAIJAN

Baku's Old City (Icherisheher):


Step back in time through cobblestone streets lined with cafés, craft shops, and heritage buildings like Maiden Tower and Shirvanshah's Palace. Explore hidden corners that reveal centuries-old stories.

Sheki - Jewel of the Caucasus:

Immerse yourself in ancient architecture and lush greenery in Sheki, famous for ornate palaces, silk workshops, and sweet halva. Visit the UNESCO-listed Khan's Palace, adorned with mesmerizing stained glass mosaics.

Gobustan National Park:

Feel history beneath your fingertips at Gobustan, a place of ancient rock carvings. Wander among petroglyphs that date back thousands of years, capturing scenes of early Azerbaijani life.



AZERBAIJANI CUISINE

Azerbaijan's cuisine is a sensory journey. Stroll through spice-infused bazaars, sampling dried fruits, nuts, and sweet treats. Don't miss the traditional Plov, a saffron-infused rice delicacy with succulent meats or fruits. Relish savoury Dolma, vine leaves carefully stuffed with aromatic fillings.





End your day sipping sweetened black tea served in traditional glasses, paired with pakhlava, a pastry layered with nuts and dripping with honey. Visit quaint tea houses or lively street cafes and taste Azerbaijan's famed pomegranate wine, a perfect companion under clear, star-lit skies.



AZERBAIJAN TOURISM MAP




TRANSPORTATION TIPS

Navigate cities with ease using affordable taxis and efficient metro services. For adventurous journeys into the countryside, hop on shared minibuses—*marshrutkas*— or enjoy smooth, comfortable train rides between cities, admiring scenic landscapes from your window seat.

STAYING CONNECTED

Staying connected is effortless in Azerbaijan.

Popular SIM providers include *Azercell* and *Bakcell*, offering tourist-friendly packages from around \$5-\$12 with plenty of data. Most cities boast reliable 4G coverage, while free Wi-Fi is common in hotels and cafes.





A realistic daily budget ranges from \$40-\$60, comfortably covering local transport, meals, accommodations, and activities. To ensure fair exchange rates, always use official banks or verified exchange offices. ATMs are plentiful in cities, accepting most international cards.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Stay safe by drinking bottled water, eating freshly prepared food, and carrying adequate travel insurance. Pharmacies are well-stocked in major cities for your needs.

THE AZERBAIJAN E-VISA

Quick Facts

• Type: single-entry online visa

• Stay: up to 30 days

• Valid: 90 days from issue

• Ports: land | sea | air

 Who: citizens of 90+ countries (find out if you are eligible)

What You Need

- 1. Passport valid 3 months beyond your trip
- 2. Online form name, passport number, trip reason
- 3. Email your visa PDF arrives here
- 4. Card or PayPal pay the fee online

Carry your passport; police may ask for ID.

Dress modestly when visiting mosques or shrines.

Use "salam" (hello) and "çox sağ ol" (thank you).

Agree taxi fares or start the meter before the ride.

Tip 5-10% in cafés if service feels good.

Keep small bills for markets and marshrutka vans.

Try local dishes like plov and dolma.

X DON'TS

Snap photos of military sites or border zones.

Display public affection in rural areas.

Enter a home wearing shoes—leave them at the door.

Talk loudly on city buses or the metro.

Drink tap water outside major cities without boiling.

Negotiate prices in supermarkets prices are fixed.

Show disrespect to national symbols or leaders.

Rely on cards in small towns—cash is king.
